Check in at the venue	All Singing Day Participants	 Attendees will be asked to engage in a temperature check upon arrival. Attendees should use the Hand Sanitiser when entering and leaving the venue. Face Coverings	All Singing Day Participants	 Face coverings are no longer required by law, but the government expects and recommends that people should continue to wear them in crowded and enclosed settings, to protect themselves and others. Where worn correctly, this can reduce the risk of transmission. Face coverings are encouraged during entering and leaving the venue. Face coverings will be optional during singing. Ventilation	Cantata Committee	 Doors and windows will be kept open to ensure good ventilation. CO2 Monitors will be placed around the venue to continuously check the air quality. Social Distancing	All Singing Day Participants and Cantata Committee	 It is now no longer a requirement to socially distance in England.
