Composer Profile: Alexander L'Estrange (b. 1974)

Alexander L'Estrange is an award-winning British composer, arranger, jazz musician, choral animateur and workshop leader, of international acclaim.

He grew up in Oxford and attended New College School, during which time he was a member of New College Choir as chorister and soloist. And later went on to read Music at Merton College, Oxford, gaining a First Class Honours Master of Arts Degree in Music.

Although with a background in English choral tradition, Alexander's compositional voice is characterised by his love for jazz harmony and groove - he is a professional jazz pianist and double bassist, as well as a jazz examiner and trainer.

Alexander is passionate about music education and his belief in the importance of singing in our schools and communities informs his compositions. Utilising these together, he teaches choirs about rhythm, groove, style, audience communication, presentation and so much more.

Known for his charismatic and engaging leadership style and consummate musicianship, Alexander has led singers in choral workshops and performances throughout the UK, from school halls, to the Lyceum Theatre and Royal Albert Hall in London, and for the King's Singers' Summer School, as well as the American Choral Directors Association in the USA.

So far, Alexander has been best known for his popular series of large-scale choral works which draw together singers of all ages across the community.

The first of these was Zimbe! Come, sing the songs of Africa! - which is a 40-minute fusion of African song and jazz.

The ingenious piece took the choral world by storm when it was released in 2008, receiving 150 performances worldwide within its first five years, something of a record for a new choral piece, and firmly established L'Estrange as one of Britain's most popular living choral composers.

From the large-scale choral works which draw together all singers, to the more intimate sacred anthems and part-songs, it is this combination which has contributed to the universal appeal of Alexander's music.

It's no wonder that he's been dubbed "the ideal 21st century musician" by Howard Goodall CBE.

Zimbe!'s success has generated a series of commissions in a similar vein, each featuring a winning combination of SATB choir, unison children's choir and professional jazz quintet.

Large-scale choral works:

Ahoy! Sing for the Mary Rose (2013) is a fusion of Tudor songs and sea shanties, commissioned to commemorate the opening of Portsmouth's state-of-the-art museum; which houses the hull of King Henry VIII's warship, the Mary Rose.

Zadok rules – hallelujah! (2013) was commissioned by the Hanover Band to celebrate sixty years since the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II.

Based on Handel's coronation anthems, the piece is scored for SATB adult choir, unison children's choir and Baroque orchestra and the text traces all of Britain's monarchs from William the Conqueror to Elizabeth II.

Song Cycle – vive la vélorution! (2014) is a choral work comprising songs (both original and arranged) about cycling and the great outdoors, performed in York Minster at the opening of the Tour de France in 2014.

His *Wassail! Carols of Comfort and Joy* which won the Music Teachers Award for Best Classical Educational Initiative, was commissioned by the United Learning group and premiered in November 2017.

In 2018 came his next large-scale work written in collaboration with his wife, composer and lyricist Joanna Forbes L'Estrange - *Freedom! The power of song* (2018), commissioned by Salisbury Choral Society, and premiered by Salisbury Community Choir.

Other large-scale choral works include: And the Stones Sing and Let All the World in Every Corner Sing.

Small-scale choral works:

Alexander's choral anthems with organ include: Lute-book lullaby and Tune me, O Lord.

In 2016 the professional chamber choir Tenebrae recorded an album of L'Estrange's sacred and jazz inspired choral works, called "On Eagles' Wings".

Unaccompanied choral anthems include: *Love Comes Quietly, My Song is Love Unknown, Oculi Omnium, Epiphany Carol* (runner-up in the St Paul's Cathedral commission competition 2013) and *Prayers For Peace*; three settings of the prayers *God be in my head, Lighten our darkness* and *The Lord's prayer*.

Most of L'Estrange's compositions are published by Faber Music. However, since 2018 some of his more recent works have been self-published through his own record label *Andagio*.

Songs

L'Estrange's output as a songwriter includes secular songs: *Love's Philosophy*; three settings for solo voice and piano of poems by Shelley, Tennyson and Byron: *She walks in beauty, Now sleeps the crimson petal* and *Love's philosophy* – which are on the ABRSM singing syllabus.

Alexander has also written a one-woman musical, in collaboration with author Michelle Magorian, called *Hello Life!* and several jazz originals recorded on the album *New Things To Say* - by his jazz ensemble 'L'Estranges in the Night'.

Arrangements

Alexander is the go-to arranger for world-class vocal groups, and he has written hundreds of arrangements of songs from across the musical spectrum for Faber Music's Choral Basics series, for which he is consultant editor and chief arranger.

As a consummate arranger, he is highly sought after by the world's leading a cappella groups including The Swingle Singers, Amarcord, Voces 8, Tenebrae, and The King's Singers, for whom he arranged and produced the *Great American Songbook* in 2013, to great acclaim.

L'Estrange's stunning sacred choral music has been recorded by the award-winning chamber choir Tenebrae on the album On Eagles' Wings.

Television

Alexander composed the theme tune and incidental music for the BBC's CBeebies programme *Magic Hands* (2012), recorded by his sons, Toby and Harry L'Estrange.

He also writes for the market-leading television production music company Audio Network Ltd with his music featuring on such television programmes as *The One Show*, *Grand Designs* and *Antiques Roadshow*.
